(What?)

- 1 The content for your project will be research (generated by you)
into the nature
requirements
peculiarities
&c
of typography for the internet

This research should consist of a set of images

that you gather and/or make
and corresponding captions (written by you)

Your page must contain a minimum of 10 entries (there is no maximum)

Begin this research immediately!

Through the collected material
you should present a clearly articulated position to the reader

- 2 Design and build a web page to present your research collection
Focus on typographic structure & hierarchy
as a way to organize the information
and visualize relationships between individual pieces

You may want to consider some useful metaphors

as ways of organizing the material
